Dear Eureka City Schools Parents:

We are pleased to announce the open registration period for Eureka City Schools' 2023-2024 After School Programs. The programs will begin on the first day of school, August 22.

Students entering grades TK-8 are invited to apply. Our After School Programs are available to students at Alice Birney, Grant, Lafayette and Washington Elementary Schools, as well as at Zane and Winship Middle Schools. In order to receive first consideration for enrollment, please submit your application any time between May 2 through June 1, 2023. Applications received after June 1 will automatically be placed on a waiting list.

The Eureka City Schools After School Programs are funded by a grant from the California Department of Education as part of the After School Education and Safety (ASES) program. This grant provides funding for students at each elementary school and the middle Schools. Due to this limited funding, far more eligible students usually apply for the program than will be accepted.

Priority for enrollment in the program is based on the following factors: foster and homeless youth status, student academic need, family financial need, and parent work schedules. An effort is made to keep siblings in the same household enrolled together. **Currently enrolled students must reapply each year.** 

Please consider the following information in deciding if the ASES After School Program is the right fit for your child.

1. The ASES grant requires full time attendance in the after school program. Students are expected to attend the full program, each day. Allowances are made for occasional early release due to appointments, participation in sports, or transportation issues. Absences are excused for illness or appointments. Students with multiple absences or frequent early release, resulting in fewer hours than **ECS policy**\* (ECS regulation 5148.2,) will be dropped from the program and their space will be given to a student on the waiting list.

2. The After School Program provides a healthy meal through the Supper Program, homework support, physical education and a variety of enrichment activities each day. There are developmentally appropriate activities at each grade level. Please carefully consider whether your child's temperament is suited for this multi-age, active, extended-day program.

If you are interested in applying for the After School Program, please fill out the attached application and return it to your school site. You can also mail your application to: Eureka City Schools, Attn: ASES program, 2100 "J" Street, Eureka, CA 95501.

You will receive notification of whether or not your child is enrolled in the program in late June. If you have any questions, please contact the ASES Program Coordinator at your child's school.

#### \*ECS Attendance/Early Release Policy

Each student admitted into a district program shall be expected to attend the full number of hours that the program is in operation every day that the student participates. When necessary, a student's parent/guardian may request, in writing, that the Superintendent or designee approve the reasonable early daily release from the after- school program. The Superintendent or designee shall not approve such a request if the student would be attending less than one-half of the daily program hours.

## Early Release Policy

Students are expected to attend the program every day. A student may be released early due to: a death/Emergency in the family, catastrophic incidents, medical Appointments, Weather conditions (especially if the child walks home), accidents or Injury/ illness that occur during program (staff will call parent or guardian), Transportation concerns, Sports events, Parallel Activities, and Other conditions (especially regarding safety) as prescribed by the school. Discuss any issues with the site coordinator. (You are also agreeing to pick up your child if they become sick or injured during the program.) Frequent early pickup may result in your child being exited from the program. Education Code 8483. I agree to the early release policy:

## RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY

Eureka City Schools contracts with a number of community organizations and agencies including the City of Eureka Recreation Division. The following Release and Waiver of Liability applies to Eureka City Schools and all contracting organizations/agencies.

In consideration for permitting my child to participate in after school- extended day activities, I hereby waive, release, and discharge any and all claims for damages for personal injury, death, or property damage which I may have or which may accrue as a result of my child's participation in said activities. I understand that the above activity may be of a hazardous nature and/or include physical and/or strenuous exercise or activity; that serious accidents occasionally occur during the above activity; and that participants in the above activity occasionally sustain mortal or personal injuries and/or property damages as a consequence thereof. Knowing the risks involved, nevertheless, I have voluntarily applied to let my child participate in said activity and I hereby agree to assume any and all risks of injury or death and to release and hold harmless Eureka City Schools and all other contracting organizations and agencies. I further understand and agree that this waiver, release and assumption of risk is to be binding on my heirs and assigns. I further agree to indemnify and to hold Eureka City Schools and all other contracting organizations and agencies (its officers, employees, volunteers and agents) free and harmless from any loss, liability, damage, cost or expense which they may incur as a result of any injury and/or property damage that my child may sustain while participating in said activity. Frequent early pickup may result in your child being asked to leave the program. Attendance is required under Education Code 8483. Talk to the site coordinator if you need special arrangements.
