- Sonny Tripp comments that the curriculum should not be put into ethnic studies.

  - Karen Skoglund and Linda Gillette got a hold of Sandy Burton, who was a previous director. Linda Gillette volunteers to bring items to Sandy to look at and give historical information on.
  - Jewell Moon- the items were appraised in 2011, she would like to work on a acquiring a current appraisal
  - Hilary asks for an update on young males who have been identified as possibilities for those who could handle the regalia on behalf of the men.
    - Jewell confirms that Rachel Bass has been following up with those who have been recommended
  - Jennifer Johnson- add the regalia collection to the library tracking system database called Destiny for the district
  - Paul Claussen, says maybe wood shop would be able to help provide frames for the art, (Sonny- Yew and Ironwood)

  - <u>Review Letter of Support for higher wages for Indian Education staff</u>, presented by PAC President Linda Gillette
    - Draft letter read aloud by Linda Gillette to the committee
    - Hilary recommends changing out the word equitable with the word competitive
    - Kim Rhoads- Brooks, points out that it is possible that the current job descriptions do not reflect the jobs that are being done by the Indian Education staff
    - Paul- Add to the letter- Competitive wages that reflect the scope and sequence of the job for ECS Indian Education program staff
    - Linda Gillette, really advocates for changing of the job descriptions

 Hilary Manion- recommends communication that this committee expects the BOT and CSEA to spend the money our committee represents the way we wish it to be spent

Meeting Norms - Indian Education PAC 2022-23

- Members shall show-up with an open mind and good intentions with a focus on supporting ECS Native American students and families
- Be prepared, stay on topic, and stick to the meeting agenda
- Be succinct, concrete, and explicit when speaking. Share airtime with others
- Begin and end on time
- Refrain from using cell phones or computers for checking email during meetings
- Before speaking, ask yourself, "is what I'm about to say going to add value to the work

and the team or would it be better to address outside the meeting?"

- Listen to understand, and ask if you don't understand
- Wait until the person speaking is finished before talking
- Disagree with ideas, not people
- For meetings held virtually via a video chat platform (Google Meet, Zoom), keep camera on whenever possible
