Notice is hereby given by Eureka City Schools ("District") that general contractors and mechanical, electrical, plumbing ("MEP") and fire sprinkler subcontractors planning to submit a proposal for the New Gymnasium and Site Improvements at Eureka High School, and/or the Quarterly prequalification for District's public works projects, will be required to prequalify pursuant to Public Contract Code § 20111.6 prior to submitting a bid or being listed as a subcontractor on a bid for the New Gymnasium and Site Improvements. Please note if your company is currently appearing on our quarterly prequalification list you must submit a new completed questionnaire to be prequalified under this Notice for the New Gymnasium and Site Improvements at Eureka High School. Prequalification application packages are available at the District's Business Office located at: 2100 J Street, Eureka CA or an electronic copy can be obtained by contacting Jen Snipes at snipesj@eurekacityschools.org. Prequalification application packets must be completed and returned to the District's Business Office – Room 104 no later than 2:00 p.m., Friday, March 5, 2021.

INSTRUCTIONS AND APPEAL PROCESS

I. OVERVIEW

California Assembly Bill ("AB") 1565 went into effect on January 1, 2014. AB 1565 amended California Public Contract Code section 20111.6 and requires all <u>prime contractors and all mechanical</u>, <u>electrical</u>, <u>plumbing ("M/E/P") and fire sprinkler subcontractors</u> to be prequalified, before bidding on public projects let by school districts if certain criteria are met. In particular, prequalification is required for contracts valued at \$1 million or more, and that are funded in whole or in part with Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 or any funds from any future state school bond. AB 1565 applies to the following license numbers:

- Prime contractors (A and B)
- M/E/P subcontractors: C-4, C-7, C-10, C- 16, C-20, C-34, C-36, C-38, C-42, C-43, and C-46.

Prequalification for the District's lease-leaseback projects will be done under a separate prequalification process.

All general contractors and M/E/P subcontractors must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to California Labor Code section 1725.5 before submitting a bid or being listed as a subcontractor on a bid for a public works project.

II. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

It is mandatory that all prime contractors and M/E/P subcontractors who intend to submit a bid for a Eureka City Schools ("District") public works project fully complete the prequalification questionnaire, provide all materials requested herein, and be approved by the District to be placed on the final qualified bidders list. If two or more business entities submit a bid on a project as a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately prequalified to bid.

As projects become available, prequalified bidders will receive advance notice from the District of upcoming projects for which they have been deemed qualified to bid and may choose to bid any or all of the projects for which they are prequalified.

The prequalification packages should be submitted under seal and marked "CONFIDENTIAL" to Eureka City Schools, 2100 J Street, Eureka, California 95501, and must be received by 2:00 p.m. on Friday, March 5, 2021. Review is tentatively scheduled for March 8th and 9th, 2021. The District will complete prequalification evaluations and will notify contractors of their status on or before March 12, 2021.

Prequalification approval will remain valid for one (1) calendar year from the date of notice of qualification, except that the District reserves the right during that calendar year to adjust, increase, limit, suspend, or rescind the prequalification ratings based on subsequently learned information and after giving notice of the proposed action to the contractor or M/E/P subcontractor, and an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a prequalification determination.

Pursuant to Public Contract Code section 20111.6(b), the prequalification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by contractors are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law, although the contents may be disclosed to third parties for the purpose of verification, investigation of substantial allegations, and in the process of an appeal hearing. However, the names of contractors applying for prequalification status shall be public records subject to disclosure pursuant to the California Public Records Act, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

III. COMPLETING THE PREQUALIFICATION PACKAGE

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity on an aggregate and per project limit, notarized statement from surety, and the most recent reviewed or audited financial statements, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. The District will use these documents as the basis of rating Contractors and M/E/P subcontractors in respect to the size and scope of contracts upon which each Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor is qualified to bid; the District reserves the right to check other sources available. The District's decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria.

While it is the intent of the prequalification questionnaire and documents required therewith to assist the District in determining bidder responsibility prior to the submission of bids and to aid the District in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of prequalification, nor any prequalification rating, will preclude the District from a post-bid consideration and determination on a specific project of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity, and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness. Contractors are encouraged to submit prequalification packages as soon as possible, so that they may be notified of prequalification status well in advance of upcoming projects.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Contractor/MEP subcontractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor becomes inaccurate, the Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor must immediately notify the District and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

The District reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the prequalification application submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time that the prequalification procedures will not be applied to a future public works project.

IV. APPEAL OF PREQUALIFICATION DETERMINATION

A Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor who has submitted a completed application form, and who receives a rating of "not qualified" from the District, may appeal that determination. There is no appeal from a finding that a Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor is not prequalified because of a failure to submit required information, but re-application during a subsequent prequalification period is permitted. A Contractor/M/EP subcontractor may appeal the District's decision with respect to its request for prequalification, and request a hearing, by giving notice to the District no later than five (5) business days after receipt of notice of its qualification status. Unless a Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor files a timely appeal, the Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor waives any and all rights to challenge the qualification decision of the District, whether by administrative process, judicial process, or any other legal process or proceeding.

If the Contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than five (5) business days after the District's receipt of its Notice of Appeal. The hearing so provided shall be an informal process conducted by a panel to whom the Board of Trustees of the District has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals ("Appeals Panel"). At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor will be advised of the basis for the District's prequalification determination. The Contractor/M/E/P subcontractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons in opposition to the prequalification determination. At the conclusion of the hearing or no later than one (1) day after completion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. The date for submission and opening of bids for a specific project will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.
